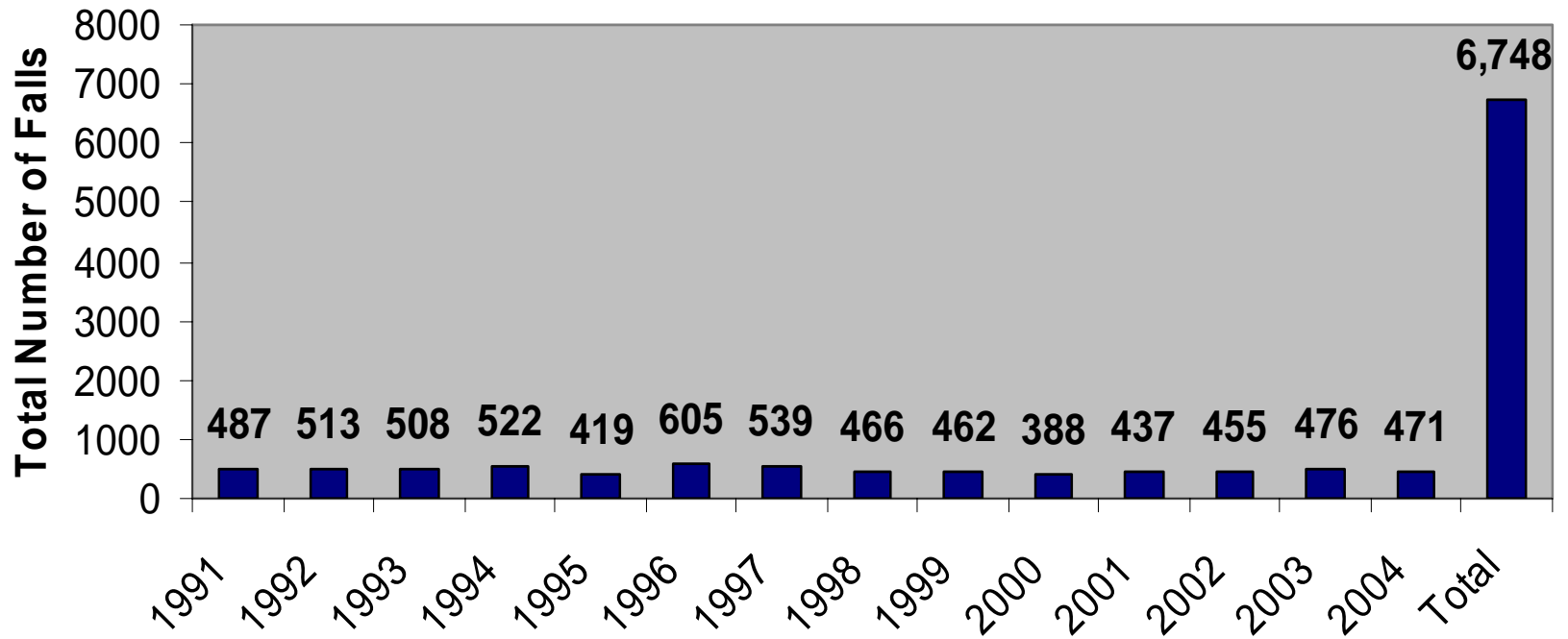

Fall Trends By County

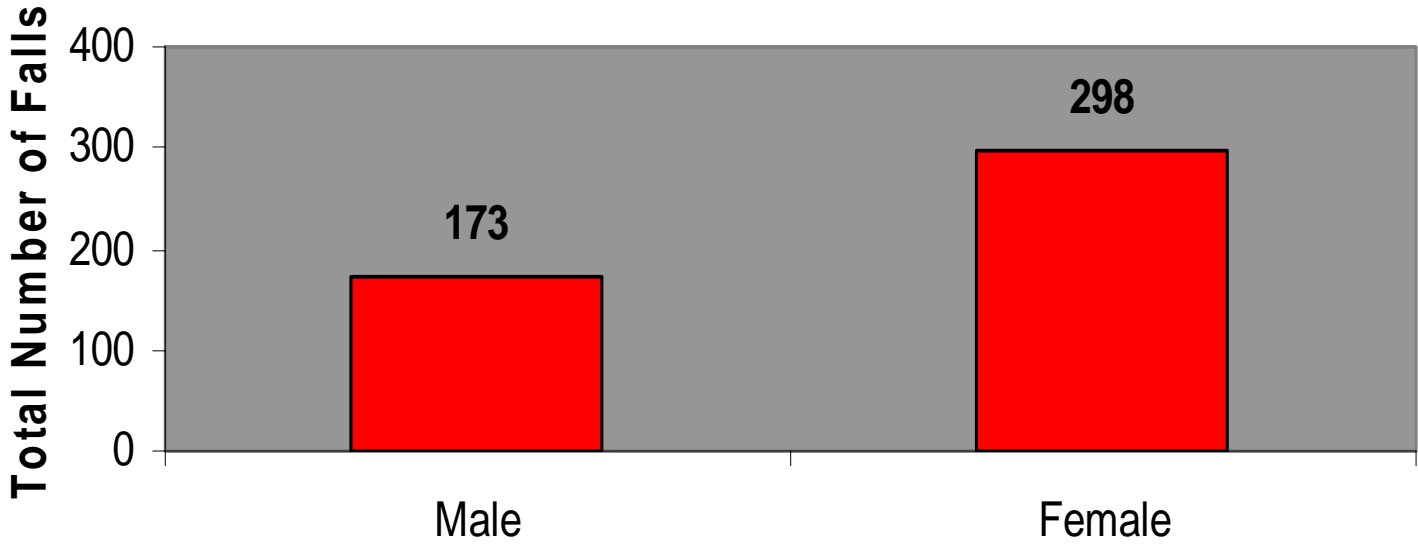

Note: Fall trends are provided for each of the coalition's counties. Trends are based on California hospital discharge data, which were prepared by the California Department of Health Services, Epidemiology, Prevention, and Injury Control Branch. Hospital discharge information is currently the best falls surveillance system in California. However, the data are limited because it only contains falls that are serious enough to warrant a hospital admission. The trends do not reflect falls that do not require medical attention and do not include fall-related ER visits that do not result in a hospital admission. Furthermore, the trends are raw numbers and have not been adjusted for population size and changes over time. Therefore, keep in mind that the charts in this packet describe raw numbers of non-fatal hospitalized fall injuries in your county. 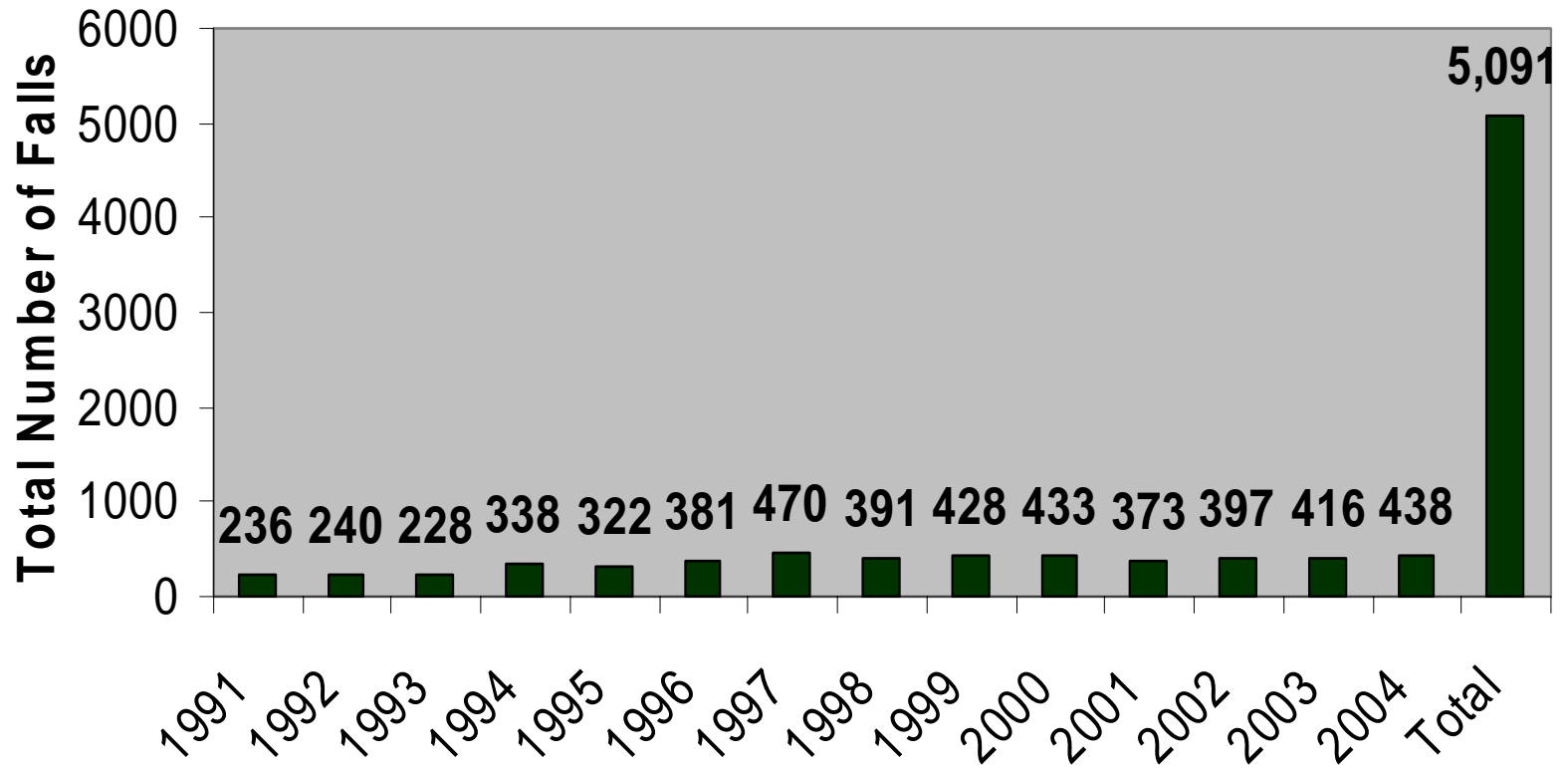
Total Number of Nonfatal Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Napa County Residents (50+) from 1991-2004



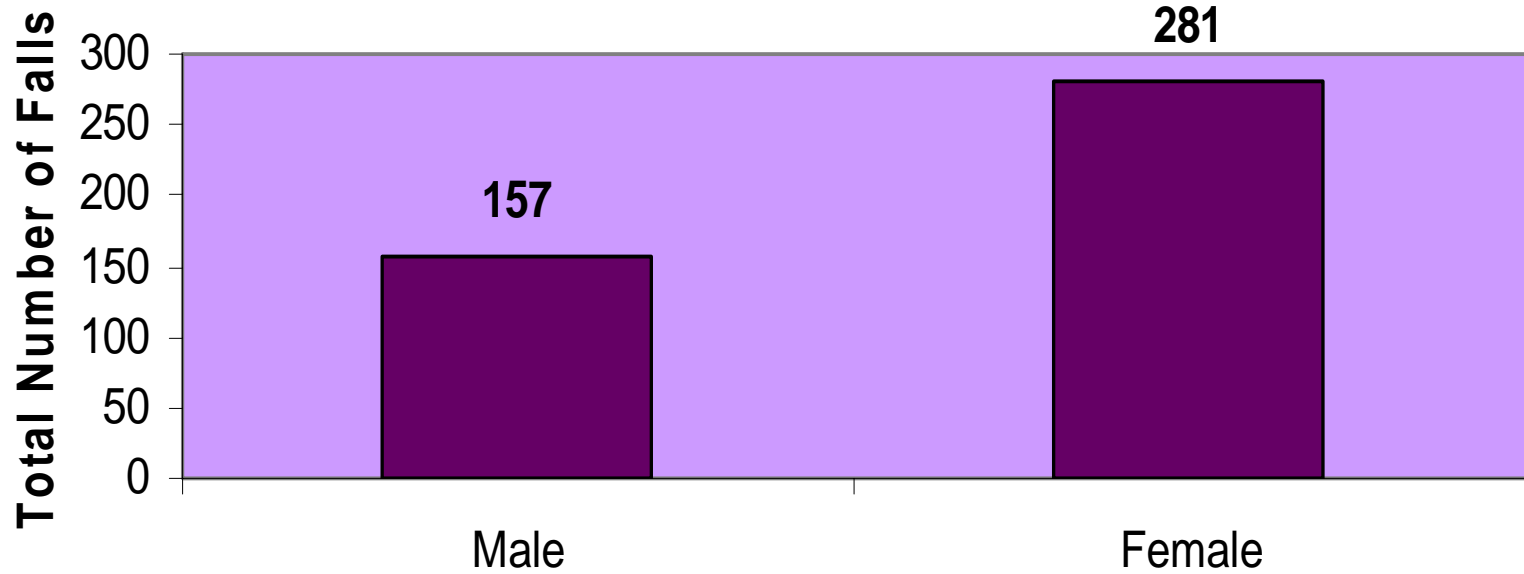
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries By Gender Among Older (50+) Napa County Residents by Gender, 2004



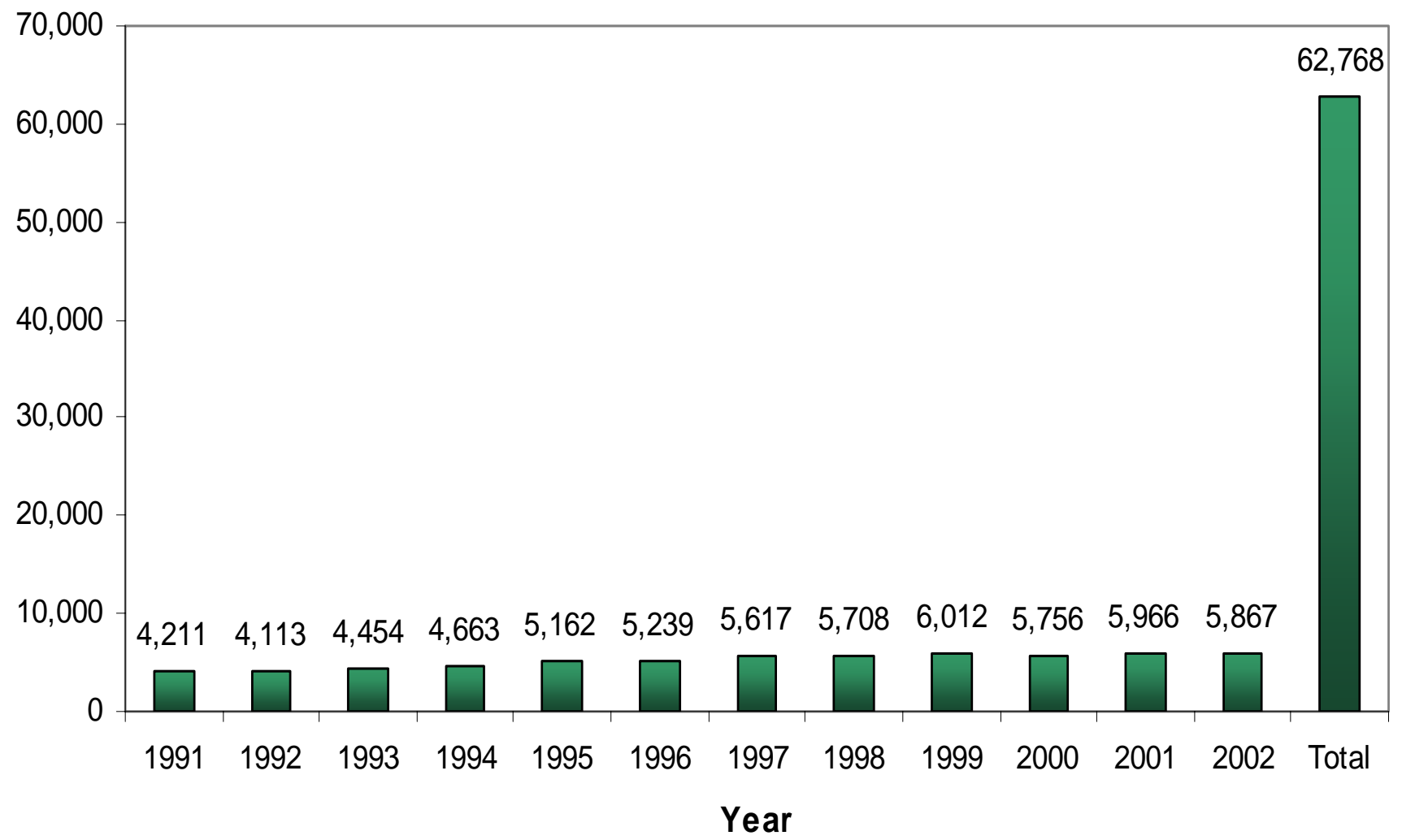
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Nevada County Residents (50+), 1991-2004



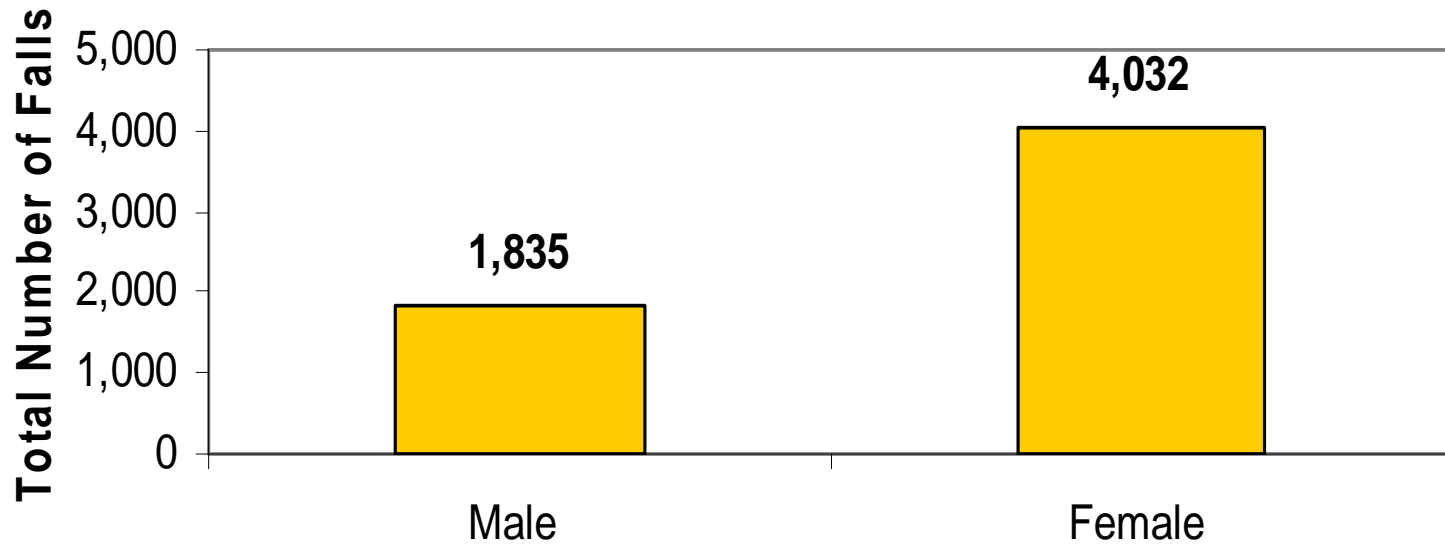
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries by Gender Among Older Nevada County Residents (50+), 2004



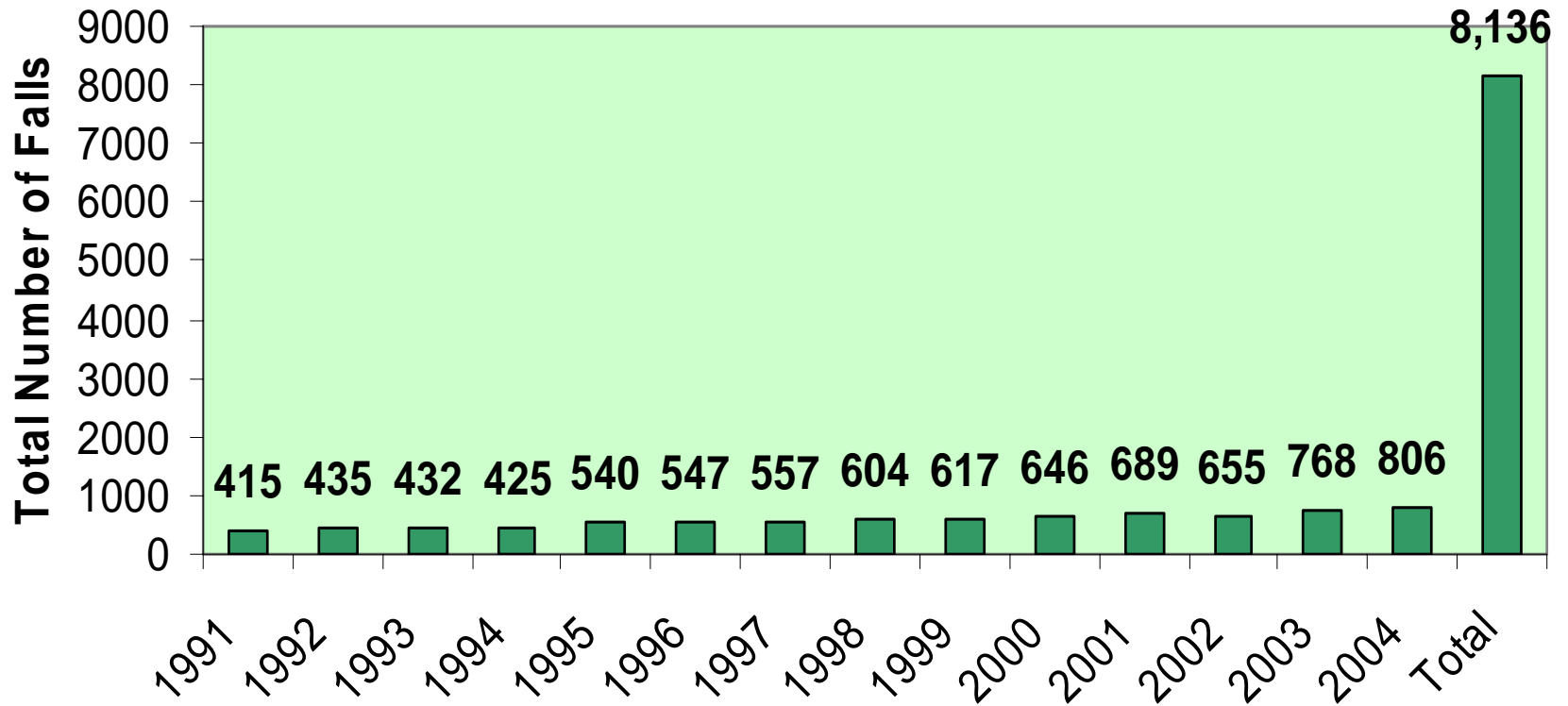
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries among Older Orange County Residents (50+) from 1991-2002



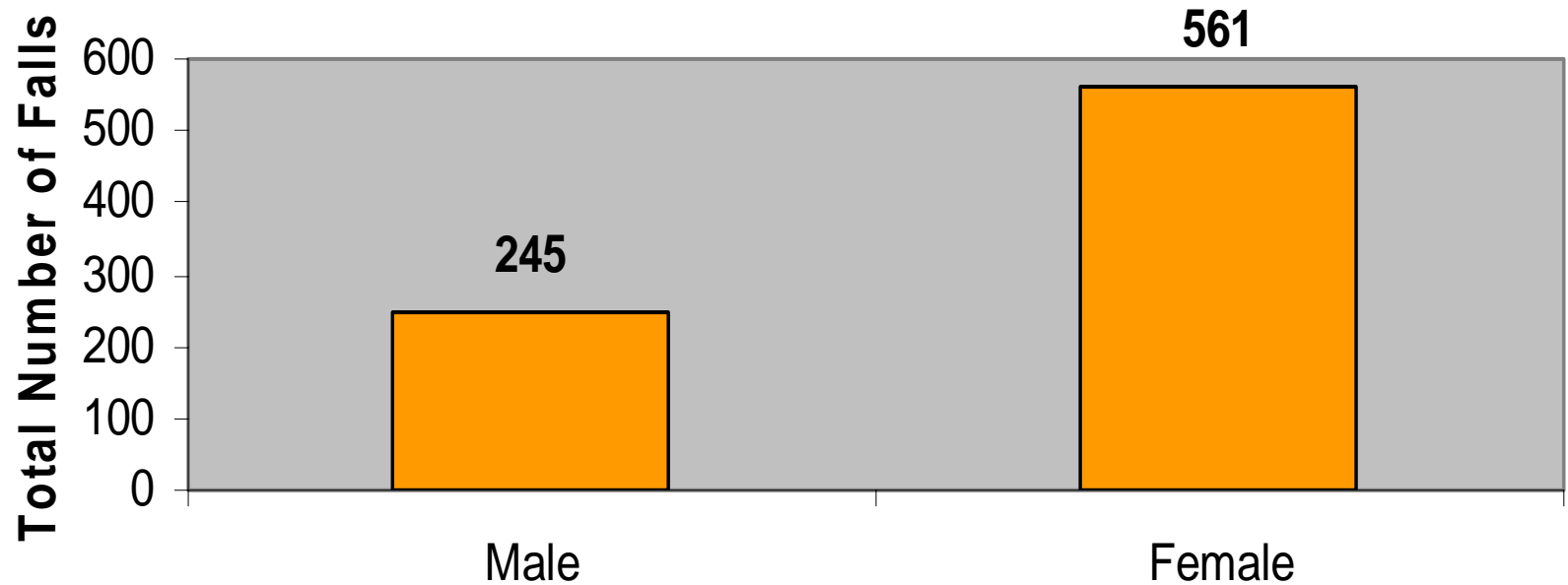
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries By Gender Among Older Orange County Residents (50+), 2002



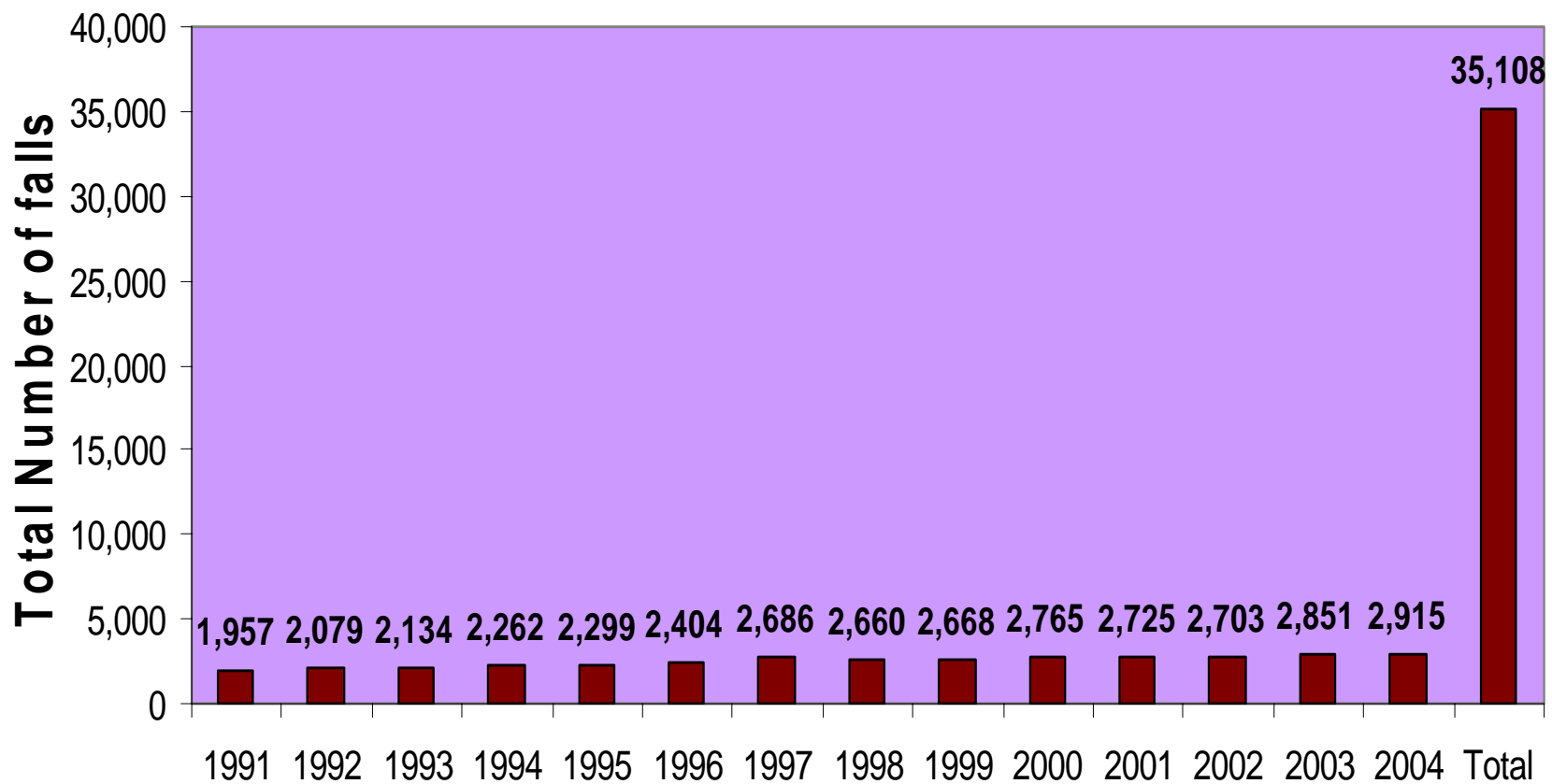
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Placer County Residents (50+), 1991-2004



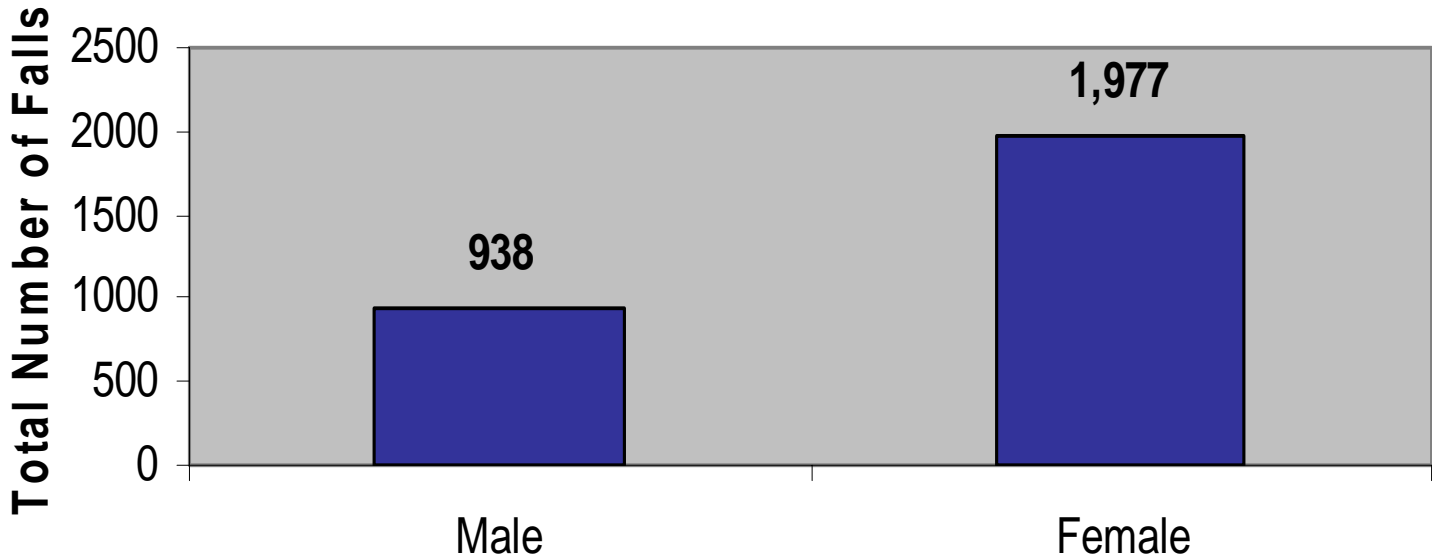
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Placer County Residents (50+) By Gender, 2004



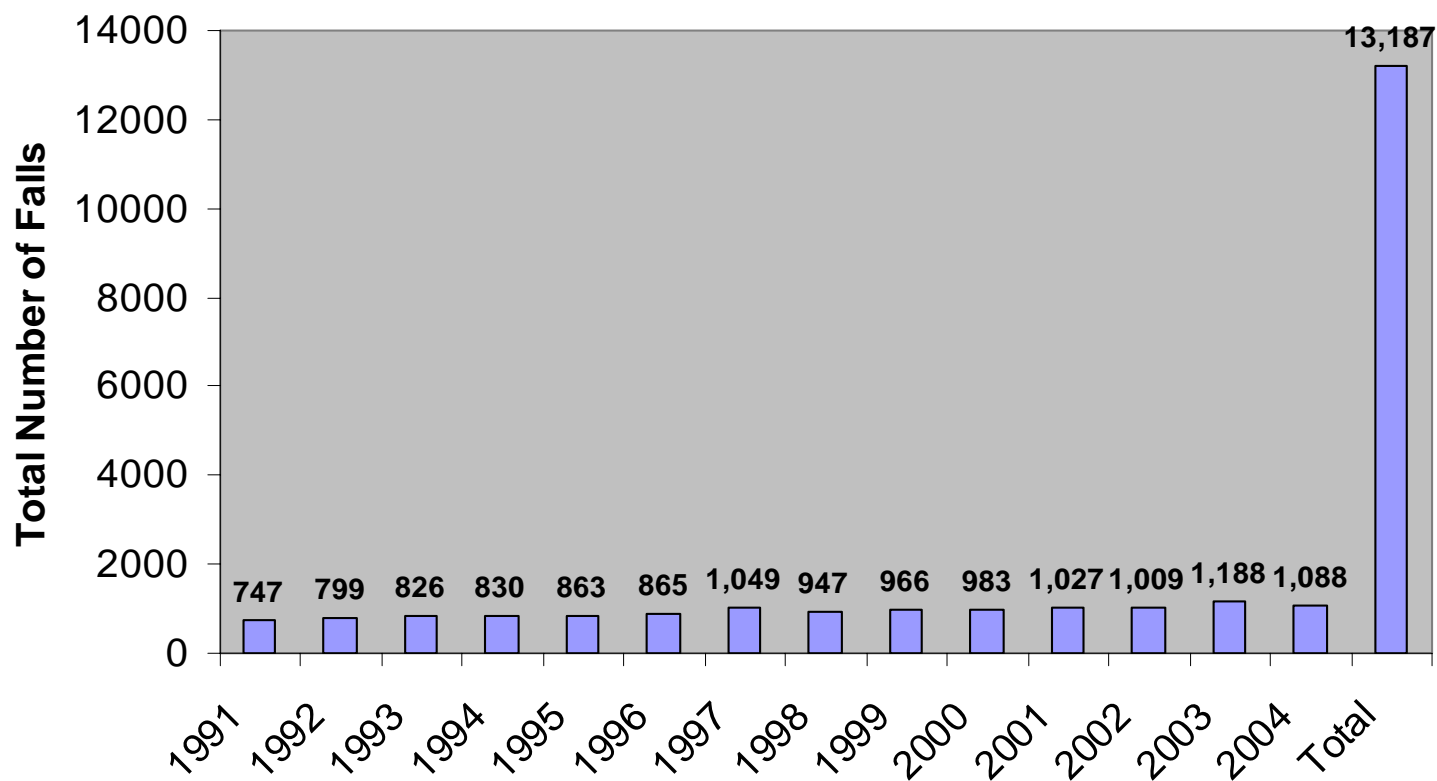
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Sacramento County Residents (50+), 1991-2004



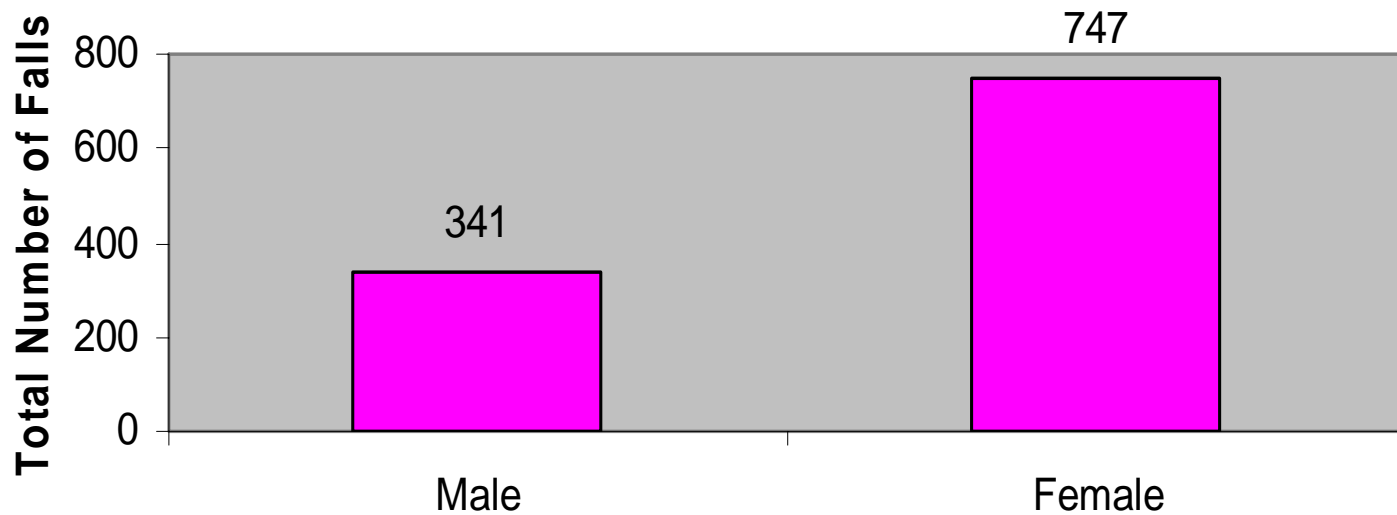

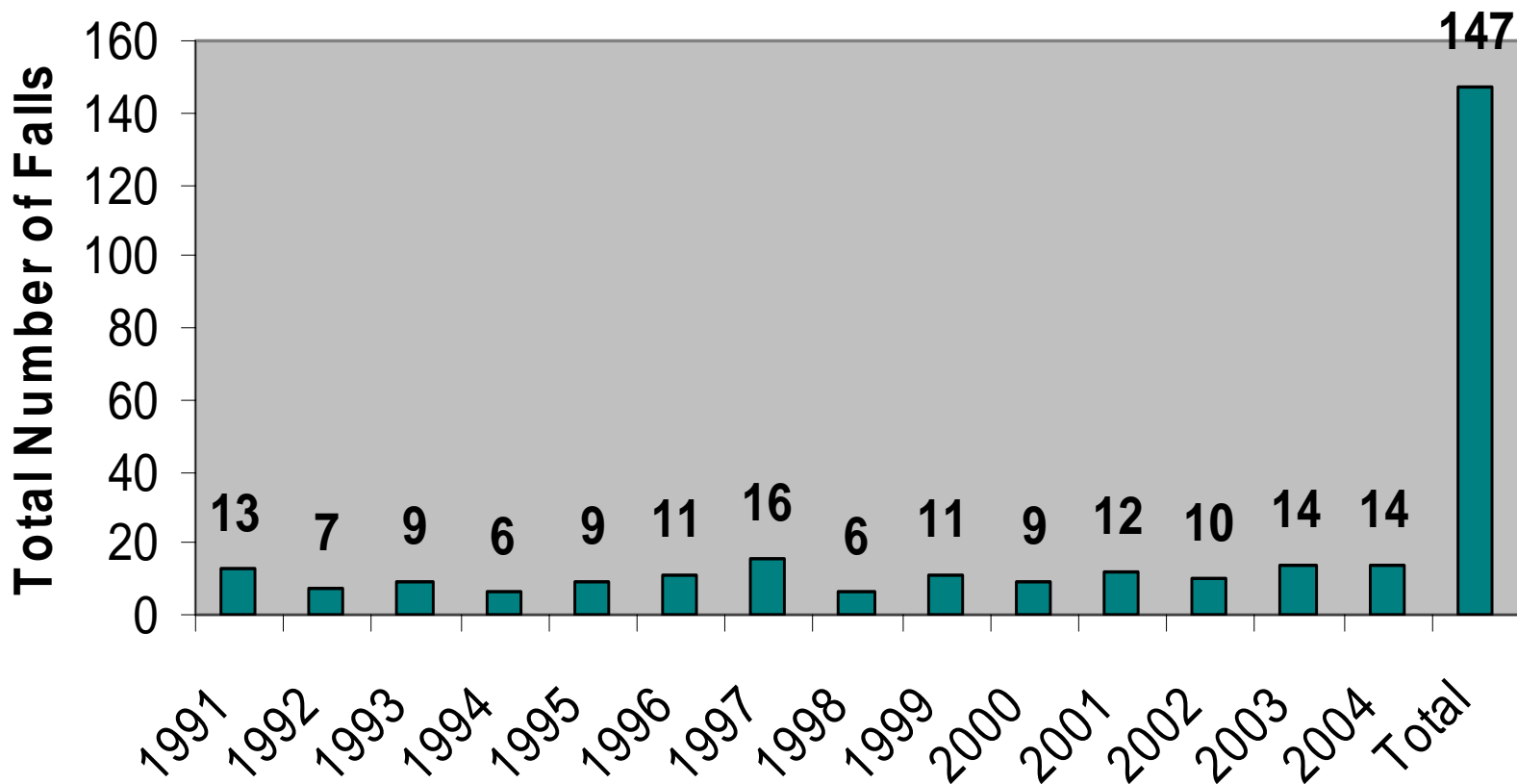
Total Number of Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Santa Barbara County Residents (50+) from 1991-2004



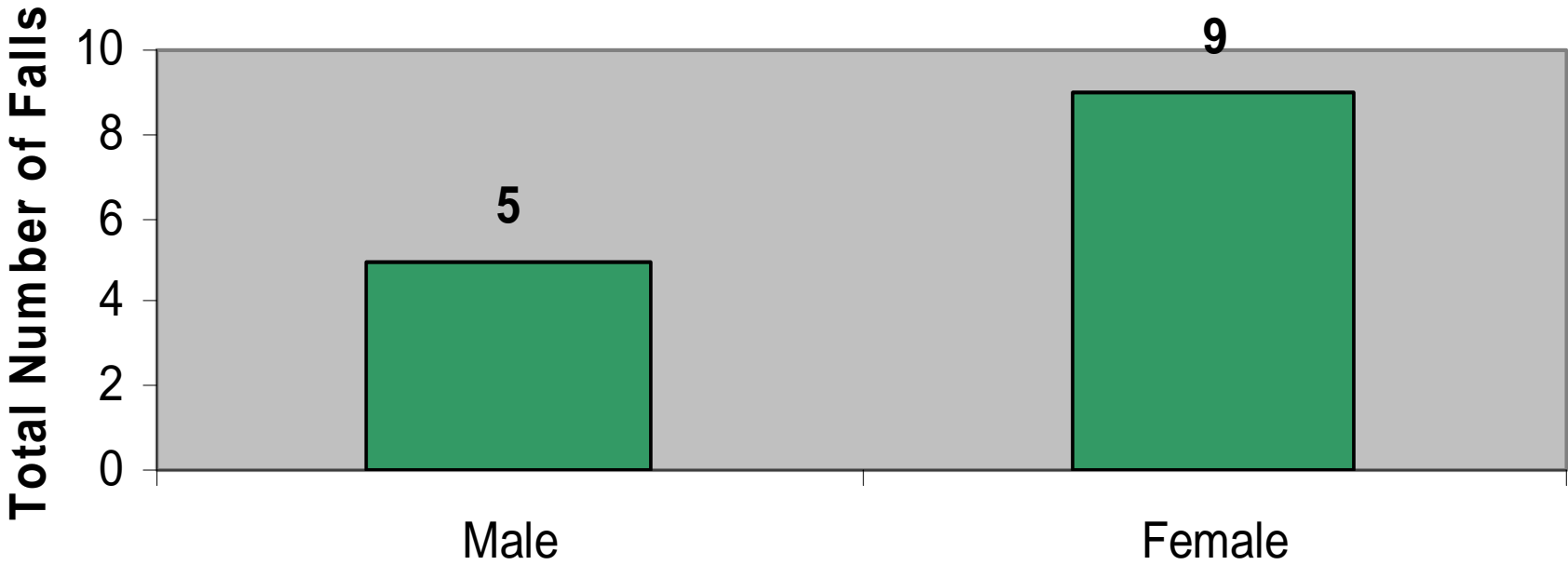
Total Number of Nonfatal Hospitalized Fall Injuries By Gender Among Older Santa Barbara County Residents (50+) in 2004



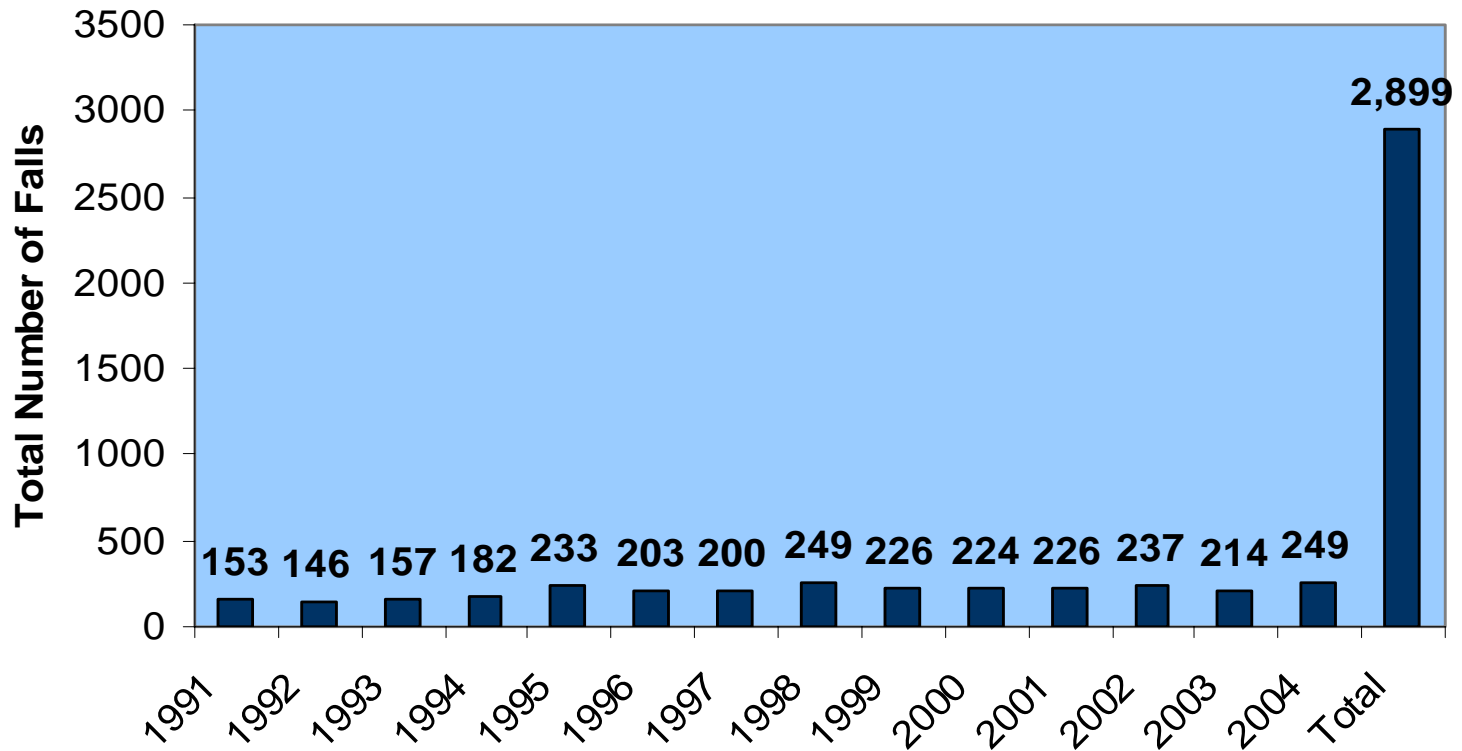
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Sierra County Residents (50+), 1991-2004



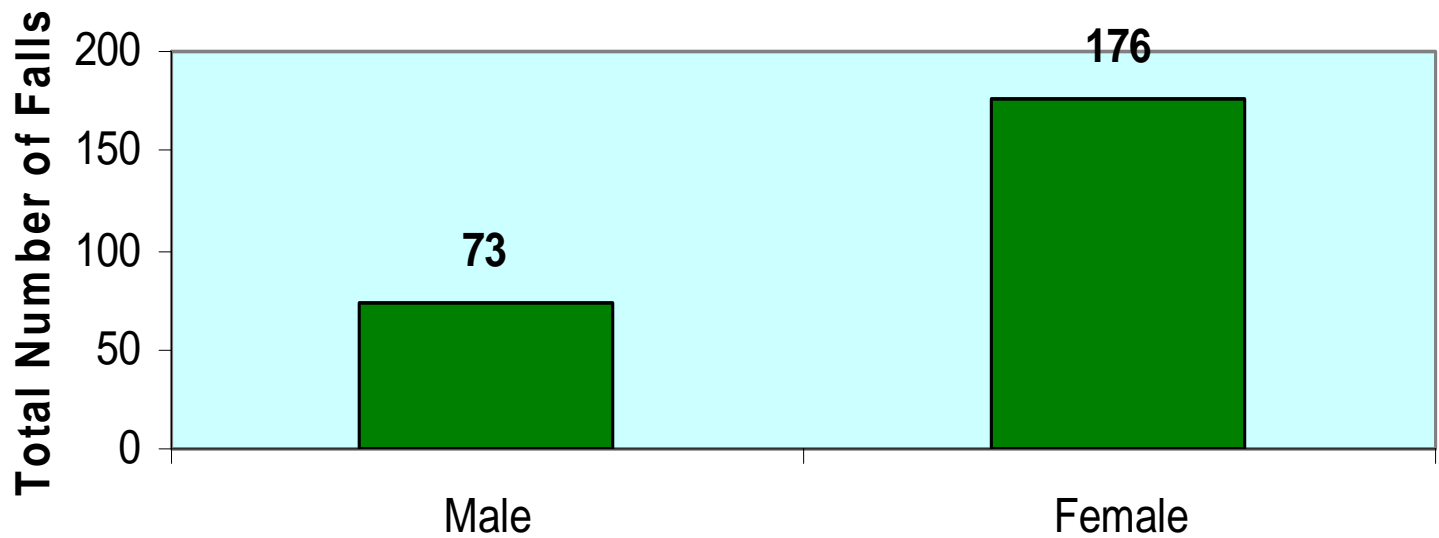
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Sierra County Residents (50+) By Gender, 2004



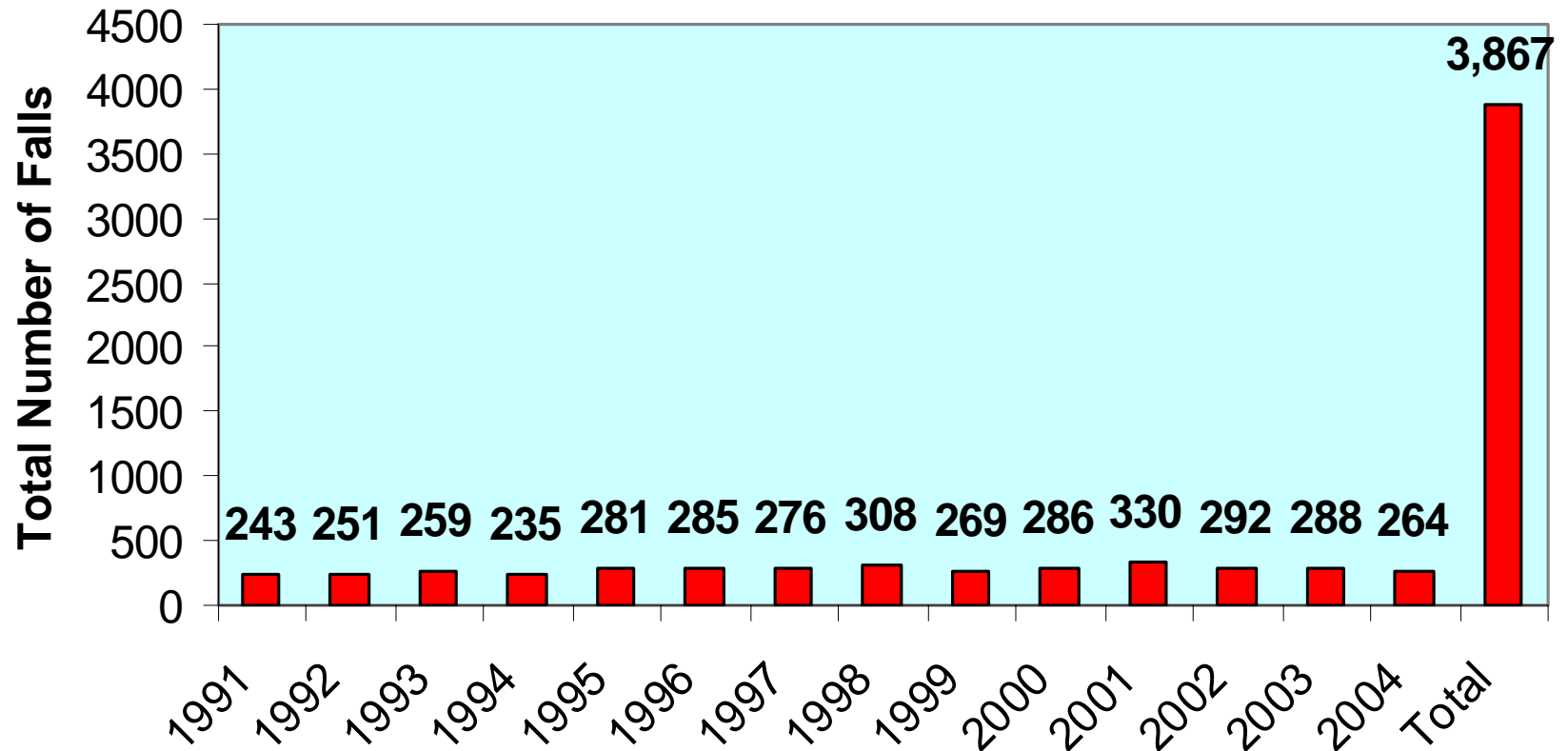
Total Number of NonFatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Sutter County Residents (50+), 1991- 2004



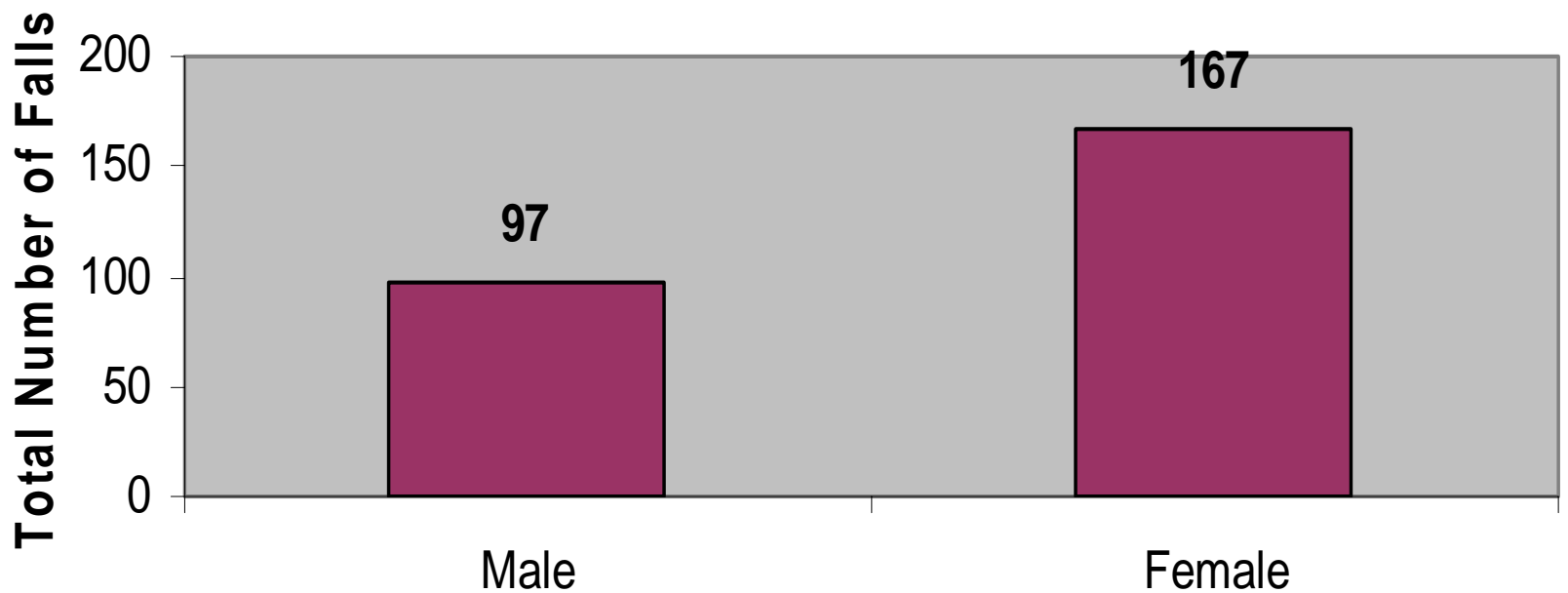
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries By Gender Among Older Sutter County Residents (50+), 2004



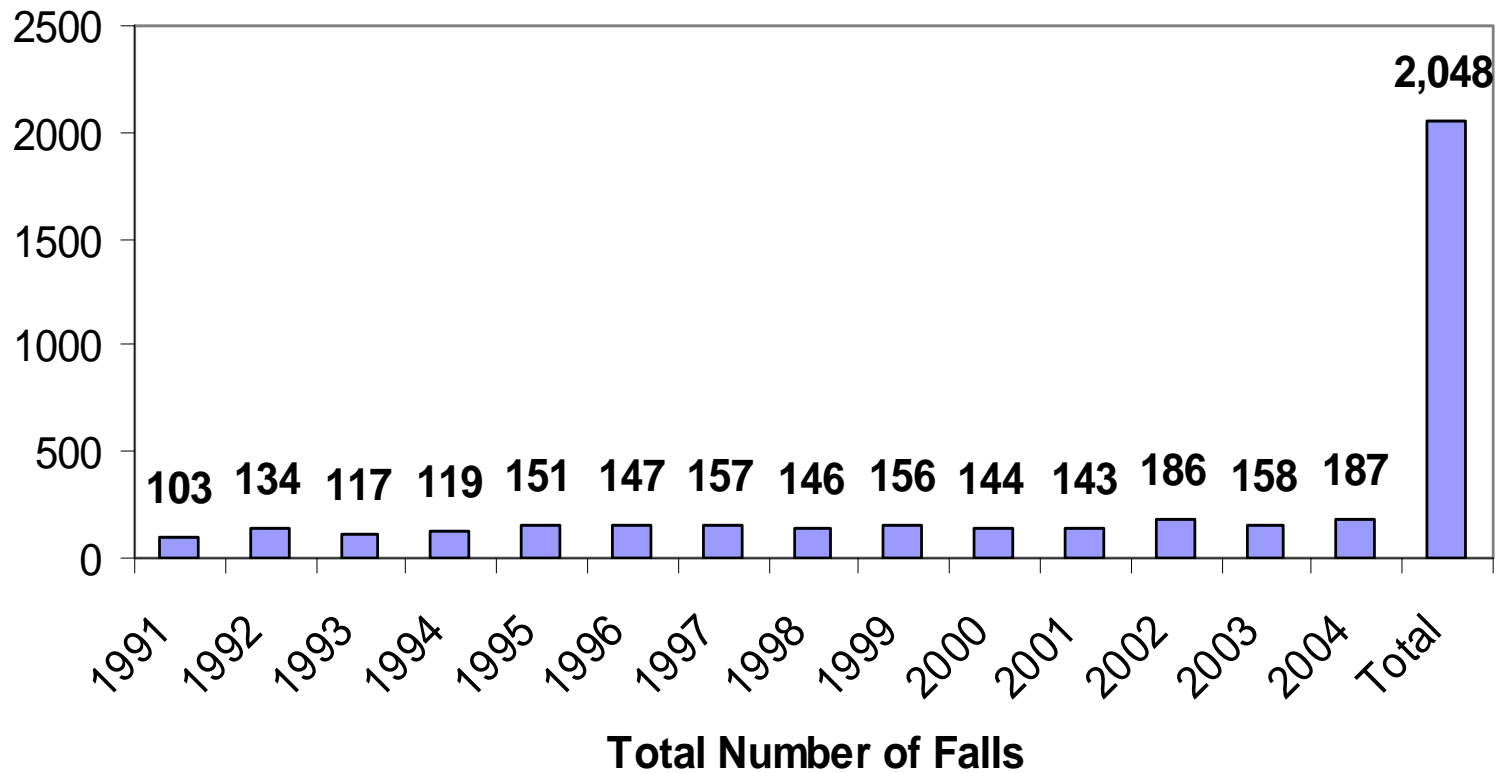
Total Number of Nonfatal, Hospitalized Fall Injuries Among Older Yolo County Residents (50+), 1991-2004
